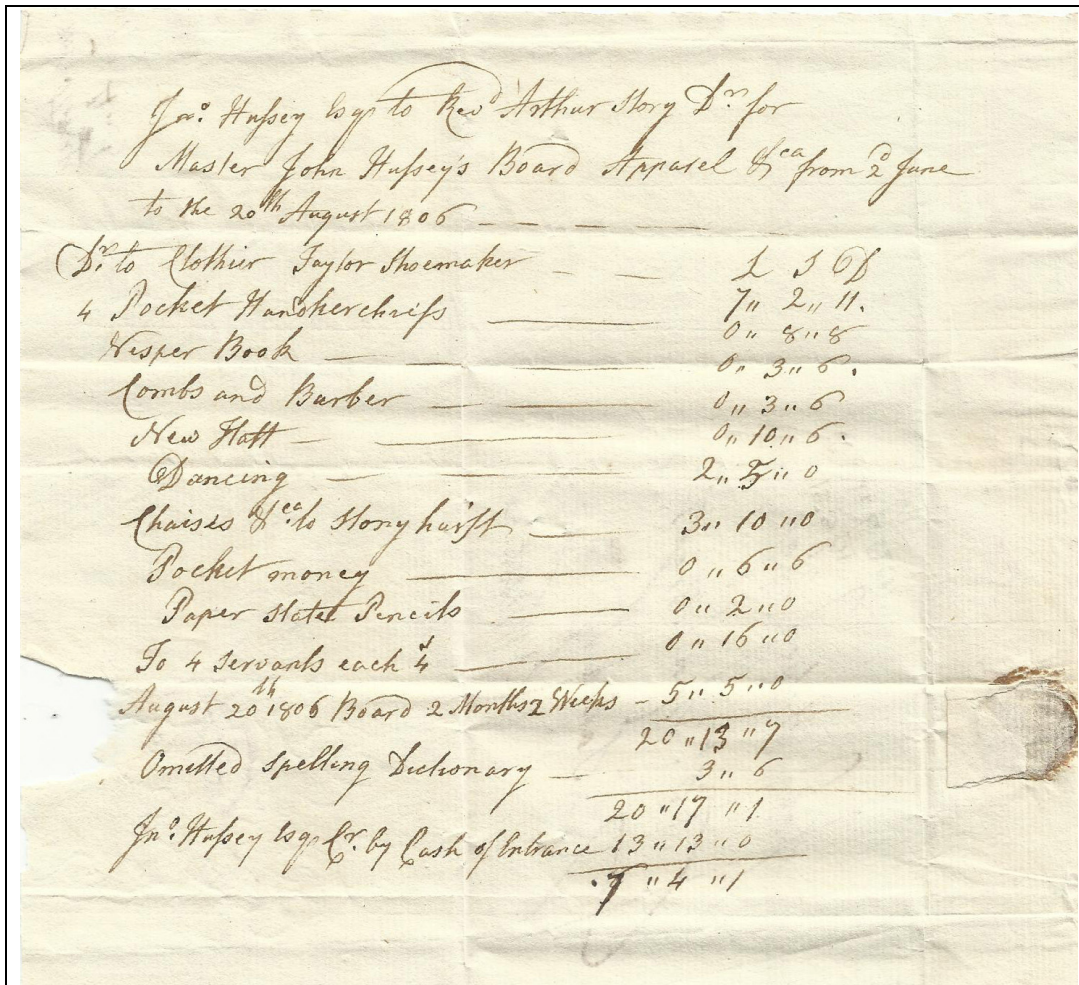


**Tudhoe School Bill, 1805, in respect of Master John Hussey**

I obtained this bill a few days ago and although Tudhoe is not written on it the combination of the Durham postmark and 'Rev Arthur Story' gave me access to your excellent website about Charles Waterton. Looking at the headings I am coming to believe that some of the items of expenditure ( e.g. clothing) and of course the Chaise reference indicate that Master John Hussey was being packed off directly to Stonyhurst at the beginning of College year. Also I have noted from my other research that Arthur Storey was supposed to have sold the school in 1805. Clearly not! Regards
